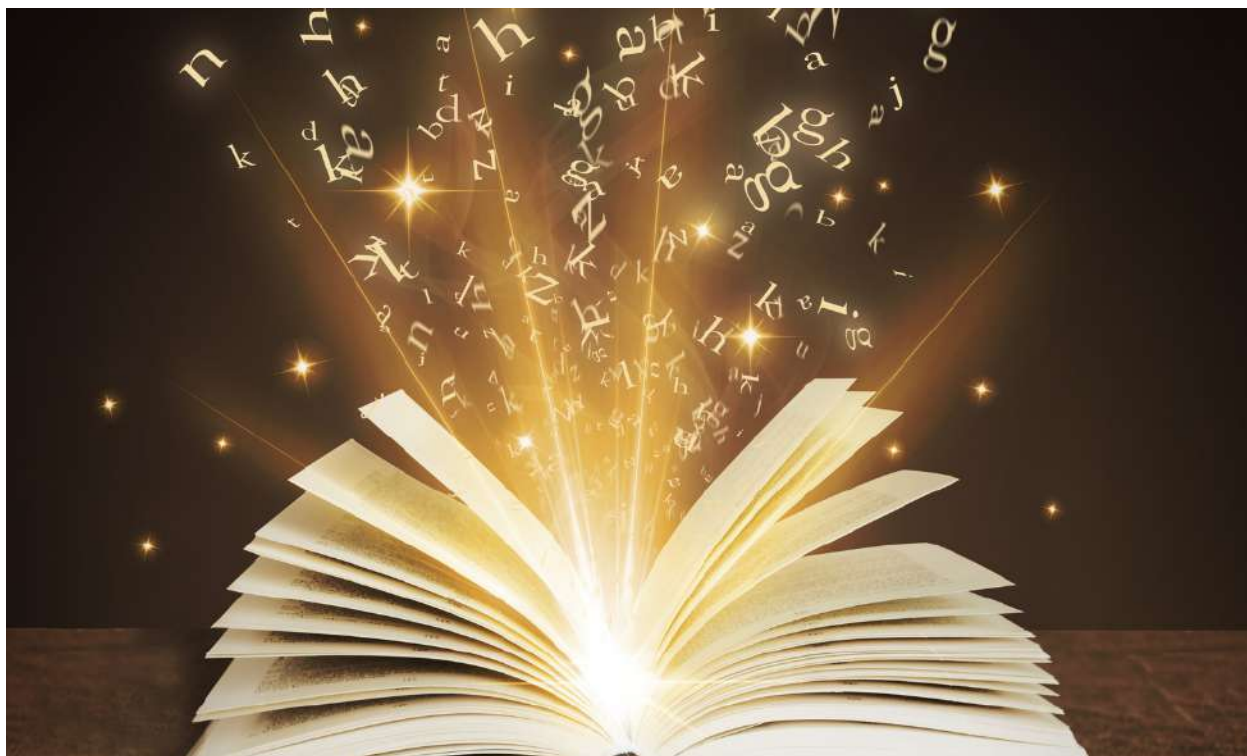




Year 4 Comprehension 13: The Lost Book
